They also attended the launch of 135 boats for the local bass tournament on Saturday morning and the final weigh-in. Chase also had the honors of helping with the afternoon release for the tournament.

We would like to give special thanks to Doug Nelson, owner Wolf River House Resort, for not only donating accommodations for the family, but also for coordinating the guides and working with the Burbach's on planning the event. And thanks to the generosity of the Winneconne community, the family was provided with meals at the Arrowhead Restaurant, Haase's Supper Club and Fin'n'Feather restaurant. They also received a gas card from Leo's gas station in Winneconne and a certificate for strawberries and gift bag from Chris Allen's Greenhouse.

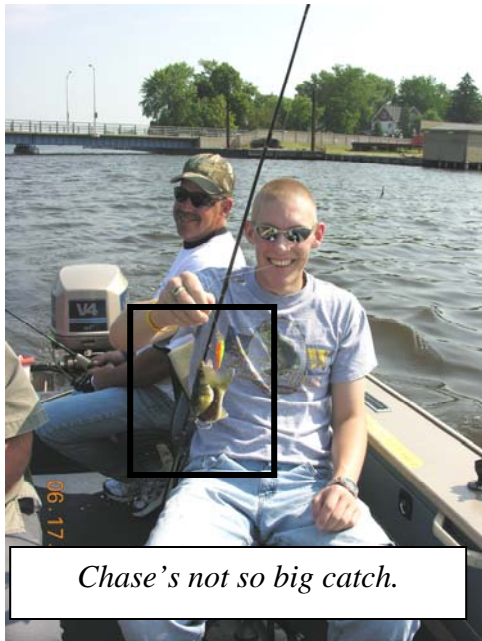

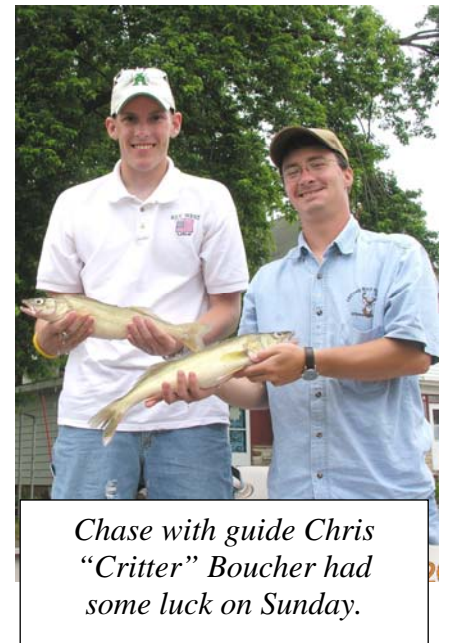

Our missions are to make sure semi trucks full of supplies get throughout Iraq in a safe manner. Some of the problems that happen are hijackings, IED's, drivers falling asleep and big potholes. We use the spot lights for all those things. We scan bridges before we go under them. We shine ditches to make sure they are clear to pass. We shine the lights at trucks to get them to wake up or turn on the lights. We use them for signals between trucks. Basically without them it is real hard to do our jobs. We do most of our moving during the night.

I'm thanking you from all of us over here. I know it would have been easy to say no to sending them because we will be home in a few months but our job is not done. It will help us do our job and keep us safe from things they try to hide at night.

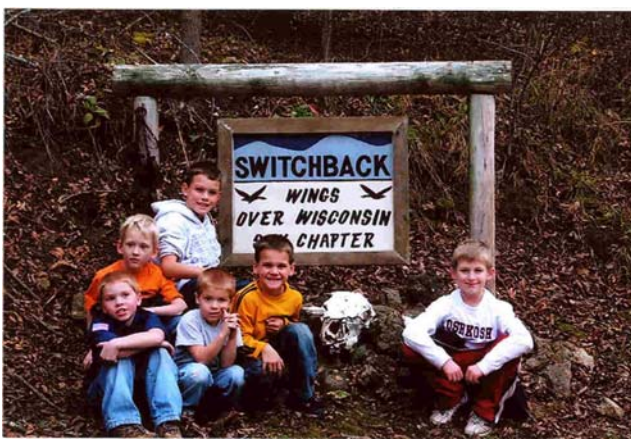

RECIPE CORNER

Fisherman's Crispy Coating

Submitted by: Gail Christian

- 1 egg
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup crisp rice cereal (crushed)
- ¼ cup flour
- ¼ cup cornmeal
- 1 ½ tsp lemon-pepper seasoning
- ¼ tsp salt
- 1/8 tsp onion salt
- 1/8 tsp garlic salt
- 4 walleye or other whitefish (2 lbs)

In a bowl, whisk together egg and milk. In large re-sealable bag, combine cereal, flour, cornmeal and seasonings. Dip fish into egg mixture then into breading mix.

In frying pan, heat ¼" oil over medium heat. Fry 5 to 7 minutes on each side or until fish flakes easily with a fork. (yield: 4 servings)

Annual Crow Counts

In the early 90's, Wings Over Wisconsin, in partnership with the DNR, released F-1 Iowa Pheasants over a three year period into certain protected habitat areas in Southern Wisconsin. Each year after, seven of our chapters participate in pheasant crowing counts for the DNR to help to determine the population growth rate or decline for the Iowa pheasants.

The volunteers for these spring surveys are asked to travel a specific route determined by the DNR. The survey is done right at sunrise and the participants indicate on the provided map where they hear the birds and also if they see any.

The chapters involved are Markesan, Tri-County, Waupun, Mayville, Beaver Dam, Kettle Moraine and Columbia. Thanks to their help, the DNR is able to better monitor the populations.

To date, the populations have remained at consistent levels, indicating that the birds are surviving our winters and also the predators in Wisconsin.

Youth Trap Team Sponsored

The Wingettes sponsored a 5 person trap team for the annual High School Shoot held at the Mayville Gun Club. The 2-day youth event had close to 500 shooters ranging in age from 12 to 18 from all over the state.
